Red Group

This team will go through **TWO** stations on Friday:

1. Surgical Skills Station

The goal of this station is to review different invaluable procedural skills for taking care of a critically ill surgical patient.

Duration: 1.5 hours

2. PAS Simulation Station

The goal of this station is to review the management of an unanticipated PAS diagnosis in the OR.

1. Maternal Code

The goal of this station is to review management of maternal cardiac arrest. This should build on and be supported by the BLS station review on the alternate day.

1. Recognize unresponsiveness and pulselessness in a pregnant patient.

- 2. Perform basic life support (BLS) measures including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and early defibrillation.
- 3. Demonstrate teamwork and communication skills including closed-loop communication, role clarity, shared mental modeling.
- 4. Discuss the coordination required to activate MTP during a code.

2. Massive Transfusion Protocol (MTP)

The goal of this station is to review the use of MTP at individual institutions and to ensure conference attendees know how to activate and use MTP.
